



TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY – Beach Monitors

The Tla'amin Nation has Aboriginal and Treaty rights to the resources in our Territory – including from our beaches (clams and oysters). We continue to be concerned about the increasing number of harvesters on the beaches and over harvesting and also people harvesting from contaminated beaches.

Tla'amin Nation is seeking two (2) individuals to assist with beach monitoring. This will require visiting identified beaches to check on the number of harvesters, provide information and education where required (ie. Limits, contaminated beaches) check whether they have permits or not, report violators, etc. There will be some training with our local Fisheries Office and joint patrols. This position will be temporary – for the summer months.

The successful applicants will be able to work on their own, have good writing skills (able to write a report) be personable and able to interact with the public.

Qualifications:

- Minimum Grade 12
- Valid Driver's licence and transportation
- Willing to undergo a criminal record check
- Outgoing – able to communicate with the public
- Good writing skills
- Able to take direction and work on own
- Be organized and responsible
- Able to work flexible shifts (with the tides and some weekends)
- No prohibitions
- Must be in good standing with the Tla'amin Nation
- Tla'amin Citizen
